At our 10.00am Mass this weekend, the <u>Dempsey Medal</u> will be presented to life-long parishioner <u>Jim Taylor</u> to honour his outstanding service to the parish, which started when he was an Altar Boy. He was one of our original acolytes (1982), serving at weekends and weekdays for over 30 years and, with wife Helen, also took Communion to the housebound. He was a choir member of the famed Radio Mass, which was recorded weekly in the convent around 1970-80. Jim acted as handyman of the parish for most of his adult life, doing countless jobs in and around the church, school, presbytery and convent. One of his last jobs (undertaken a couple of years ago, without prompting) was to check that all the pews in the church were firmly attached to the floor and to secure them with new brackets and screws if needed. His detailed memories provided invaluable input to the parish history written for the centenary in 2017-18. We congratulate and thank Jim, and hope that he is able to return to our Sunday Mass soon.

Established in 2017, the <u>Dempsey Medal</u> is awarded by the Archbishop of Sydney to acknowledge those whose diligence and efforts within their parish deserve special recognition. Nominations for next year's medals close on 31 October.
